
Word mapping process

Say It

Students identify the picture & say the word.

Map It

Students map the word by using their finger to tap each sound.



Graph It

Students write

stamp them, or
use letter tiles to
represent the
sounds and spell
the word. Some
pages have cut
& glue letters.

Write It

Students then write the word.


Make it more hands-on

Say It

Students identify the picture & say the word.

Students use their finger to tap each sound they hear in the word. They can also clap, color a circle, or put a disc or cube for each sound.




Build It


Students cut and glue the letters that make the sounds they hear.


Write It

5 Options for easy differentiation








Students say, map, graph, write. They can tap, chop, color or place a disc, cube, or eraser in the circle for each sound to make it more hands-on.


Optional cut and paste letters provide word building and fine motor skills practice.

A less busy format used in a center for students to say the picture, tap the letters on the side to map them, then cut and paste to spell the word.

Includes 2 simpler, less busy formats



Graphemes are provided for younger students just learning letter sounds or students who need a visual reference to help them write letters correctly.



Again, graphemes are provided for younger students. This format has bigger spaces for students to place cubes, discs, or use bingo blotters to map the word. It also has a bigger space to write the word.

What is Word Mapping?

Word mapping, also known as phoneme-grapheme mapping, is an instructional activity where students link the 'sound' part of a word to the 'letter' part of a word. Word mapping activities are a physical way

to represent the relationship between


Tapping with a finger and 'mapping each sound allows students to phy sounds they represent and helps orthographic mapping.

Orthographic mapping is "a ment store words for immediate, effort use to take an unfamiliar printed recognizable word." (Kilpatrick 20


