

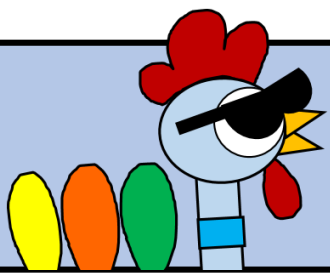
TURKEY IN DISGUISE

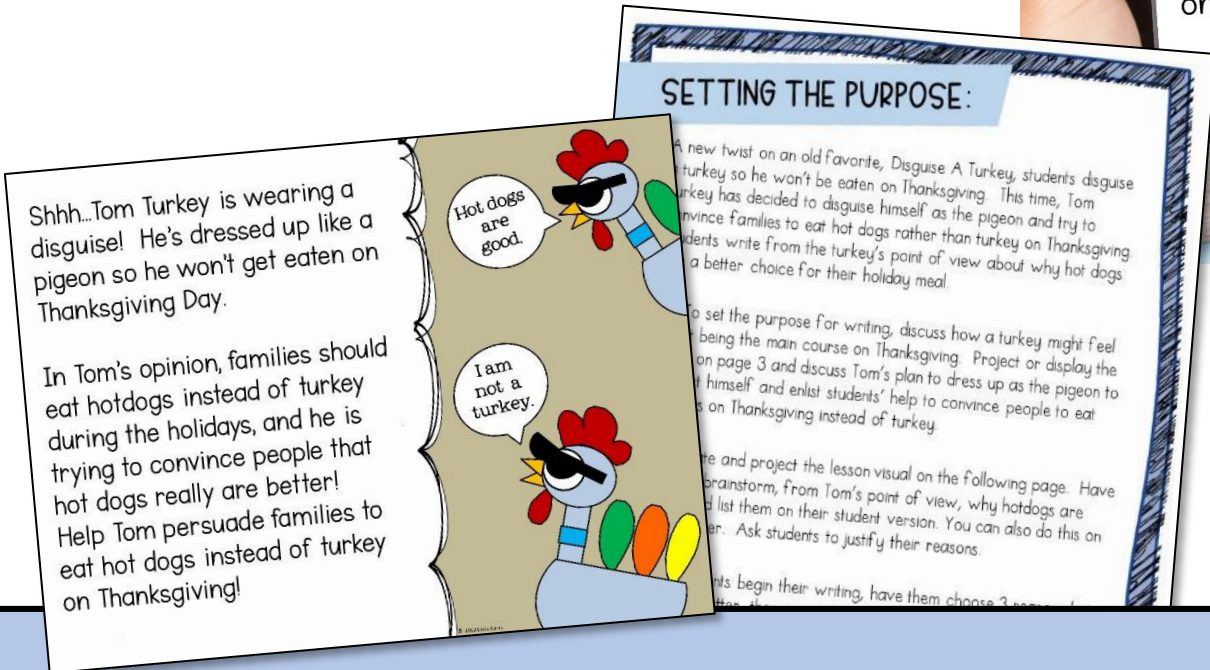
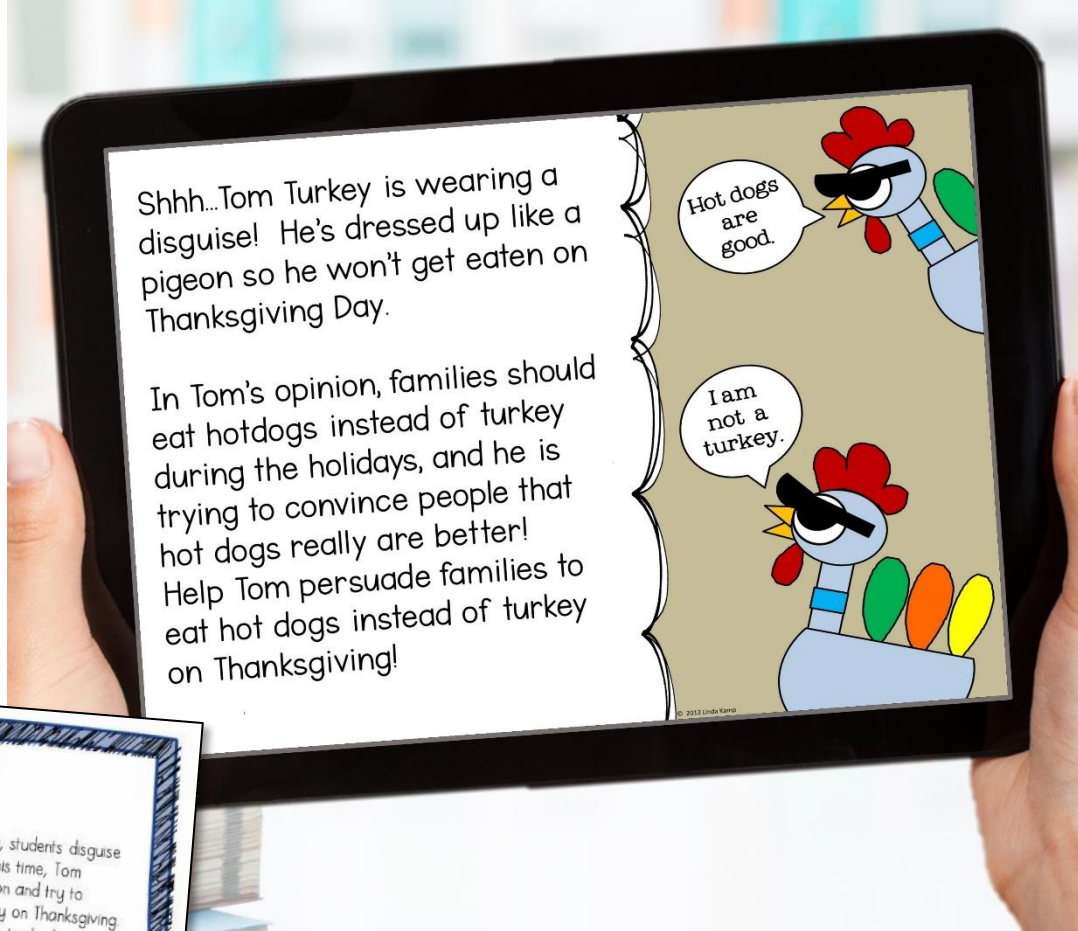

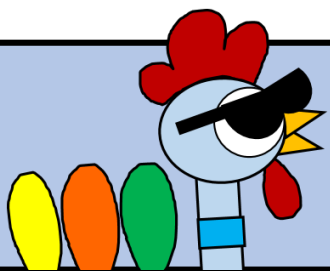


SET THE PURPOSE

Poor Tom Turkey doesn't want to be eaten on Thanksgiving so he disguises himself as the Pigeon!

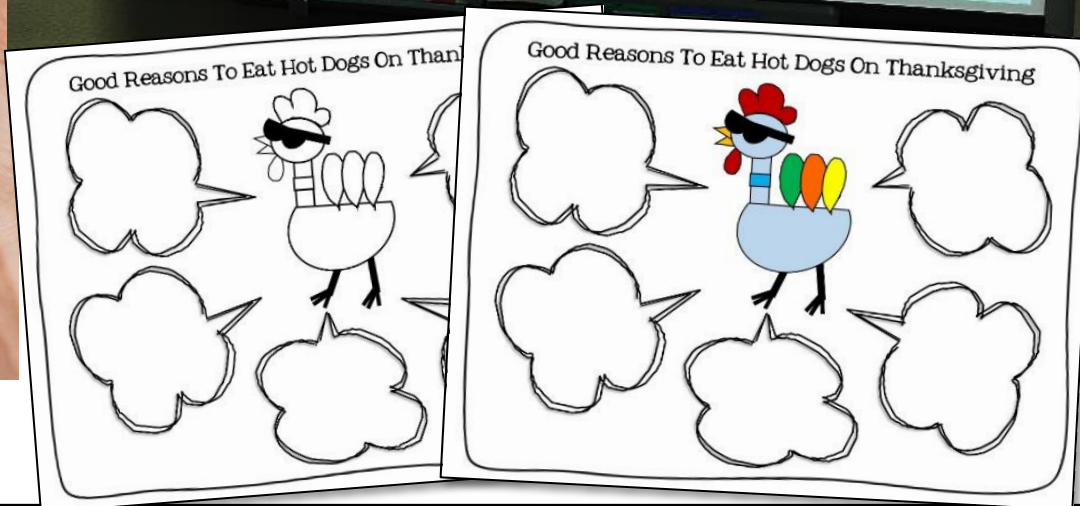
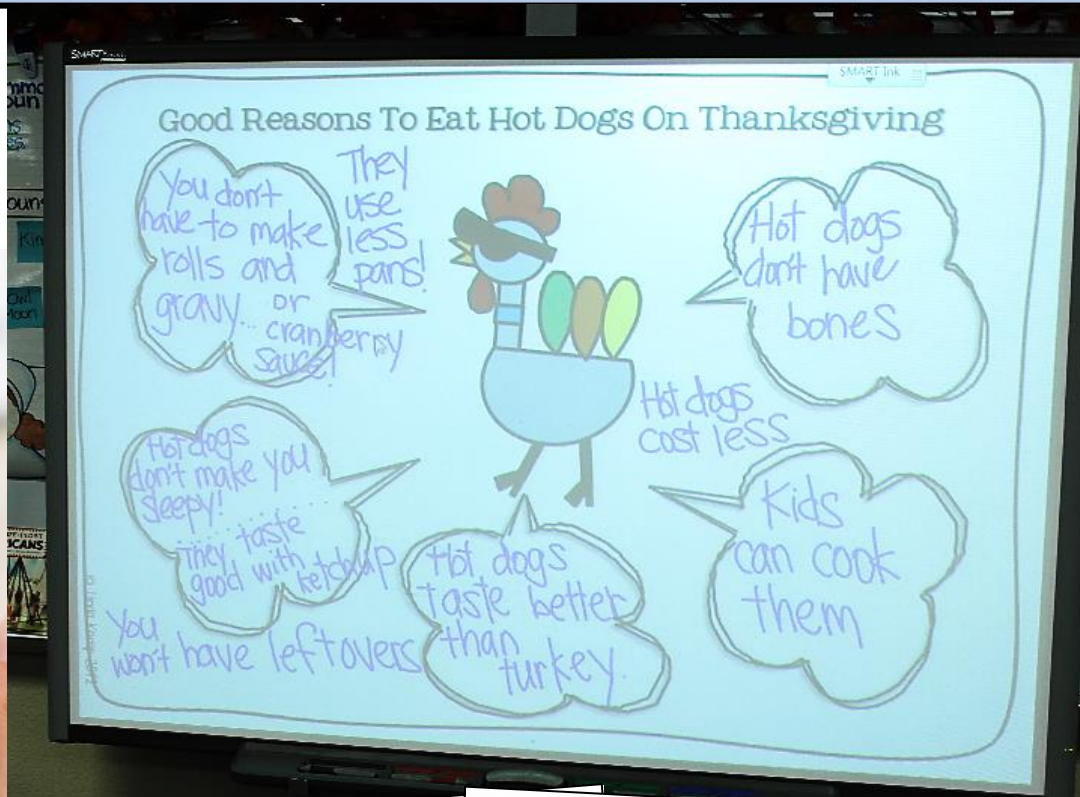

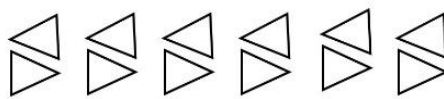
SETTING THE PURPOSE:

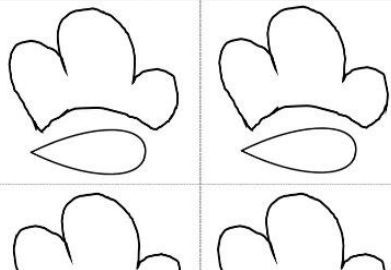

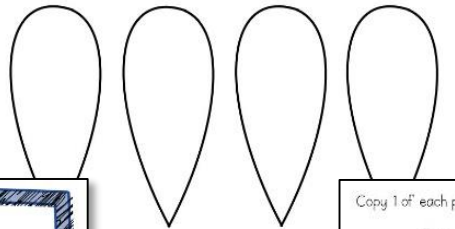

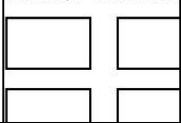
Caruncle and Wattle Copy 1 set per student on red paper



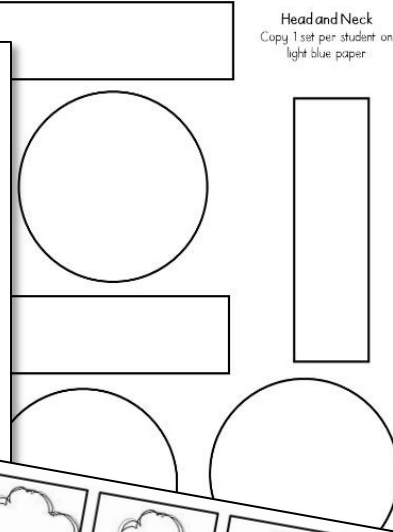
Tail Feathers Copy 3 per student on different colors



Neck Stripe Copy 1 per student

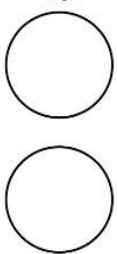


Head and Neck Copy 1 set per student on light blue paper

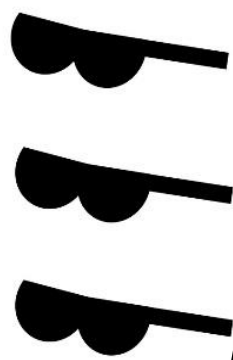

MAKING THE BOOKLETS

You will need per student:

- 1 9 x 12 piece of light blue paper
- 2 (booklet body)
- 1 booklet body tracer
- 1 head and neck template on blue paper
- 1 neck stripe on royal blue paper
- 1 beak triangle on orange paper
- 1 set caruncle and wattle on red paper
- 3 tail feathers on various colors
- 1 eye & sunglasses template on white paper
- 1 set of writing templates on white paper
- 4 4" by 1/4" black strips (2 for legs, 2 to cut into toes)



ASSEMBLING THE BOOKLETS



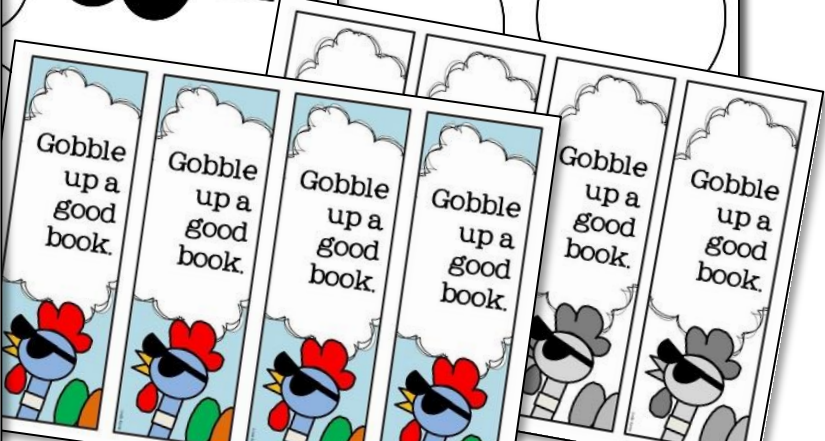
- 1 Fold the 9 x 12 blue construction paper in half. Trace the booklet body placing the straight edge of the template on the fold. Cut out the booklet sides and bottom leaving the fold as is.
- 2 Glue the white eye circle to the larger head circle.
- 3 Glue the edges of the beak and the wattle to the back of the left side of the head.
- 4 Glue the caruncle to the top front of the head.
- 5 Glue
- 6 Glue the head to the neck allowing about 1/2" of overlap.
- 7 Glue the neck to the back of the booklet body allowing about 1" of overlap.
