





Read the following directions aloud to students to guide them in completing their word ladders.


- 1. Say the picture name at the top of the ladder. Write the word. Let's spell the word together. (BELT)
- 2. Change one letter to match the picture in the next line. What letter did you change? (E to O) What is the new word? Spell it (BOLT).
- 3. Change one letter in bolt to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (B to C) What is the new word? Spell it. (COLT)
- 4. Change one letter in colt to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (T to D) What is the new word? Spell it. (COLD)
- 5. Change one letter in cold to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (C to F) What is the new word? Spell it (FOLD)
- 6. Change one letter in fold to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (F to H) What is the new word? Spell it (HOLD)

Read the following directions aloud to students to guide them in completing their word ladders.

- 1. Say the picture name at the top of the ladder. Write the word. Let's spell the word together (LIMP).
- 2. Change one letter to match the picture in the next line. What letter did you change? (I to A) What is the new word? Spell it. (LAMP).
- Change one letter in lamp to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (L to R) What is the new word? Spell it. (RAMP)
- 4. Change one letter in ramp to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (R to C) What is the new word? Spell it. (CAMP)
- 5. Change one letter in camp to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (C to D) What is the new word? Spell it. (DAMP)
- 6. Change one letter in damp to match the picture on the next line. What letter






When to use Word Ladders




- During phonics lessons as practice or review






Or use the 1-picture prompt version for students to generate their own words!
