


Read the following directions aloud to students to guide them in completing their word ladders.

- 1. Say the picture name at the top of the ladder. Write the word. Let's spell the word together. (BOMB)
- 2. Change one letter to match the picture in the next line. What letter did you change? (B to C) What is the new word? Spell it (COMB).
- 3. Change one letter in comb to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (C to T) What is the new word? Spell it. (TOMB)
- 4. Change TWO letters in tomb to match the picture on the next line. What letters did you change? (T to L and O to A) What is the new word? Spell it. (LAMB)
- 5. Change one letter in lamb to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you change? (A to I) What is the new word? Spell it (LIMB)
- 6. ADD one letter to limb to match the picture on the next line. What letter did you add? (C) What is the new word? Spell it (CLIMB)

#### **Teacher Directions**

Read the following directions aloud to students to guide them in completing their word ladders.

- 1. Say the picture name at the top of the ladder. Write the word. Let's spell the word together (KNEE).
- 2. ADD one letter to match the picture in the next line. What letter did you add? (L) What is the new word? Spell it. (KNEEL).
- Change TWO letters in kneel to match the picture on the next line. What letters did you change? (E to A and L to D) What is the new word? Spell it. (KNEAD)
- 4. Change THREE letters in knead to match the picture on the next line. What letters did you change? (E to O, A to C, D to K) What is the new word? Spell it.
- 5. Change one letter and REMOVE one letter in knock to match the picture on the next line. What letters did you change? (C to T and remove K) What is the new
